Dear Mr. Matulic:

As requested, I have examined questioned signatures purportedly written by Norval Morrisseau on six paintings delivered by courier on November 21, 2011.

Questioned Signatures:

- Q1: Painting titled "GREAT JOURNEY" bearing signature "Norval Morrisseau", written with brush and paint on its reverse side.
- Q2: Painting titled "INORGANIC BEING WITH SHAMANS" bearing signature "Norval Morrisseau", written with brush and paint on its reverse side.
- Q3: Painting titled "THUNDERBIRD-2 OF 2" bearing signature "Norval Morrisseau", written with brush and paint on its reverse side.
- Q4: Painting titled "THUNDERBIRD-1 OF 2" bearing signature "Norval Morrisseau", written with brush and paint on its reverse side.
- Q5: Painting titled "THUNDERBIRD AND EVIL SERPENT" bearing signature "Norval Morrisseau", written with brush and paint on its reverse side.
- Q6: An untitled painting bearing signature "Norval Morrisseau", written with brush and paint on its reverse side.

I have also examined the known signatures described as written by Norval Morrisseau on the documents and painting prints as detailed below. These signatures were examined and scanned by me on March 30, 2010 at Maslak McLeod Gallery, Toronto in the presence of Mr. Joseph McLeod. The documents were returned to Mr. McLeod on completion of on-site examination.

Known Signatures:

- K1: A two-page Letter dated December 30, 1968 bearing a known signature on page # 2.
- K2: A Letter dated January 15, 1965 bearing a known signature.
- K3: Photocopy of a handwritten Note beginning with words "So I will close..." bearing a known signature.
- K4: An autographed book "The Art of Norval Morrisseau" bearing a known signature on the inner title.
- K5: A painting's print titled "Community Development" bearing a known signature written with pencil.
- K6: A painting's print titled "Great Circle" bearing a known signature written with pencil.
- K7: A painting's print titled "Vision to its Soul" bearing a known signature written with pencil.
- K8: A painting's print titled "Images of Nature" bearing a known signature written with pencil.
- K9: A painting's print titled "Ojibway Thunderbird" bearing a known signature written with pencil.

I have also examined other known signatures described as written by Norval Morrisseau on the reverse of two paintings titled "SACRED MEDICINE BEAR CHANGES" and "SOARING THUNDERBIRD", hand delivered by Mr. James White of White Distribution Ltd. Caledon on May 06, 2011. These paintings were examined and photographed, and the originals were returned to Mr. White on May 31, 2011.

- K10: Painting titled "SACRED MEDICINE BEAR CHANGES" bearing signature "Norval Morrisseau", written with brush and paint on its reverse side.
- K11: Painting titled "SOARING THUNDERBIRD" bearing signature "Norval Morrisseau", written with brush and paint on its reverse side.

I have also examined other known signatures described as written by Norval Morrisseau on six original certificates of authenticity as detailed below:

- K12: An original Certificate of Authenticity dated April 11, 2002 for an artwork "GREAT JOURNEY, 1978".
- K13: An original Certificate of Authenticity dated April 11, 2002 for an artwork "THUNDERBIRD-1 OF 2, 1977".
- K14: An original Certificate of Authenticity dated April 11, 2002 for an untitled, 1980 artwork".
- K15: An original Certificate of Authenticity dated April 11, 2002 for an artwork "THUNDERBIRD-2 OF 2, 1977".
- K16: An original Certificate of Authenticity dated April 11, 2002 for an artwork "THUNDERBIRD AND EVIL SERPENT, 1976".
- K17: An original Certificate of Authenticity dated April 11, 2002 for an artwork "INORGANIC BEING WITH SHAMANS, 1976".

I have also examined another known signature described as written by Norval Morrisseau on the color copy of certificates of authenticity, received via courier on December 09, 2011 from Mr. James White of White Distribution Ltd. Caledon, as detailed below:

K18: Color photocopy of a Certificate of Authenticity dated April 12, 2002 for an artwork "YOUR IN THE FOURTH DIMENSION".

The copies of these documents/signatures are attached with this report for ready reference.

Purpose of the Examination:

The signatures described above were examined in an effort to determine, if possible:

 Whether the questioned signatures Q1 to Q6 were written by the writer of known signatures K1 to K18?

Background Information Provided:

Mr. Norval Morrisseau suffered from Parkinson's disease in the later years of his life.

Examinations Conducted:

- 1. Visual and macroscopic analysis of the questioned and known signatures.
- Comparison of the questioned signatures Q1-Q6 with the known signatures K1-K18.

Observations and Findings:

The questioned signatures Q1-Q6 are written with brush and paint on canvas. The signatures Q3 and Q6 show some lighter strokes and lesser clarity in their execution. This factor has been given due consideration.

Giving due consideration to the possible natural variations in brush and paint writings as compared to the writings written with pen, ballpoint pen or pencil on paper surface; the questioned signatures have been found to be written freely and fluently. These signatures do not show hesitations, slow drawn strokes, unusual shadings or lack of natural writing flow.

The known signatures show a wide range of natural variations in their inter-se comparison. The signatures K6 and K8 are written as "Norval M", the signature K2 and K3 are written as "Norval Morriseau" (with single "s" in word "Morriseau") and the signatures K1, K5, K7 and K9 are written as "Norval Morrisseau" (with two "s" in word "Morrisseau"). The signatures K4 and K9 show more abbreviation of the terminal portions as compared to the other known signatures. The signatures K12-K18 show decline in the muscular co-ordination, resulting in slow writing speed, presence of tremor, change in the alignment (more pronounced in K16 and K17) and difficulty in execution of strokes. The known signatures K10 and K11 are written with brush and paint on canvas like the questioned signatures.

The questioned signatures were examined minutely and compared against the known signatures. This process involved a comparison of the writing features including letter proportions; abbreviations; connections, direction of strokes; freedom of execution; line quality; method of production of letters; overall pressure and pattern of pressure emphasis; size; skill; slant; spacing; speed and range of variation-see illustrative charts 1-14.

It was determined as to whether the writing characteristics present in the questioned signatures are in the parameters of natural variations present within the known signatures. The comparison showed significant similarities in the writing characteristics and some variations which are detailed and marked on illustrative charts.

In addition to the similarities detailed on the illustrative charts, the questioned and known signatures also have similarities in the writing features detailed below:

- The questioned signatures and the known signatures K1-K11 reveal similar order of writing skill and muscular co-ordination. As mentioned earlier, the known signatures K12- K18 show decline in the muscular co-ordination.
- The questioned signatures and the known signatures K1-K11 reveal moderate writing speed and gradation in the writing pressure. The known signatures K13-K18 reveal comparatively slower speed.
- The relative position of words "Norval" and "Morrisseau" in the questioned signatures is similar to the relative position of these words in the known signatures K1, K10, K11 and K12.
- 4. The apex of the right shoulder of letter "M" is placed at a higher level than the apex of its left shoulder in the questioned signatures and in the known signatures K1-K17.
- 5. The letters in these signatures have similar combinations i.e. letters "N", "o", "R" and "v" in word "Norval" are written separately, whereas the letters "a" and "I" in this word are connected with each other. Similarly, the letters "M", "o", "R", "i" and first "s" in the second word in the questioned signatures and the known signatures K1-K11 are written separately, whereas the remaining letters in this word are connected with each other.

Please refer to the attached illustrative charts for these observations.

Conclusions:

Examination and comparison of the questioned and known signatures as described in detail in the report and on the illustrative charts lead to the following conclusions:

- 1. It is highly probable that the questioned signatures Q1, Q2, Q4 and Q5 were written by the writer of known signatures K1 to K18.
- It is probable that the questioned signatures Q3 and Q6 were written by the writer of known signatures K1 to K18.




INORGANIC BEING WITH SHAMANS








THUNDERBIRD-2 OF 2








THUNDERBIRD-1 OF 2
